









BREAKING BARRIERS: GROWING FUTURE FARMERS

A National New Farmer Framework is needed to grow the next generation of farmers and ensure that Canada has farm renewal and food sovereignty!

Agriculture in Canada faces a farm renewal crisis as the farming population continues to age and decline. Currently, only 1.3% of the Canadian population is involved in agriculture and Canada is losing young farmers at more than double the rate that it is losing farmers¹. Since 1991, Canada has lost one third (32.8%) of its farm operators and over two thirds (70.9%) of its young farmers. As of 2021, only 8.6% of farm operators are under the age of 35 (22,625)². New and equity-seeking farmers face significant challenges to access land, capital, knowledge and training. These barriers along with a lack of local infrastructure and agricultural supports hinder the growth of new farms.
